#### Richard Myers

##### White Station & Whitehaven STEM Improvements



Richard Myers is leading an 8-year-old effort to privately design, fund and build physical plant improvements at the area's two top public high schools: White Station and Whitehaven. Guided by extensive school master plans the University of Memphis drafted for the group, \$650 Thousand was raised for two projects recently completed at White Station. Two more projects are in the planning phase there now.

A 24,000 square foot STEM facility at Whitehaven High is the group's next effort. \$5.5 Million has been raised and pledged to date, including a generous gift from East Memphis Rotary. The facility will include 4 AP science labs, 3 Honors science labs, a computer lab, 3 classrooms and a 1600 square foot robotics lab.

Richard will explain the model for completing these efforts, including a separate 501c3 fiscal agent, private/public partnership and leadership. He'll also explain the need.

Richard, who is from Los Angeles, is the father of two sons who graduated from White Station. He is an attorney at Glankler Brown and a graduate of Loma Linda U, the University of Chicago and Cornell Law School.

#### Andy Nix



There are many jobs available across the city with workers ready to fill them, but many have no transportation. Andy Nix, president and CEO of MyCityRides, has closed this gap by offering an affordable solution - Scooters! This 501(c)3 organization is using scooters to address the transportation issues that keep people from getting to work.

You can own your ride with the purchase of a scooter for \$90 a month which includes all maintenance and accessories. The scooter gets 89 miles to the gallon, a great savings as compared to other means of transportation. MyCityRides has 322 Scooters on the road, covering 782,000 miles. This mode of transportation helps working people regain time and save money - and it's fun!
