November 16, 2022 Gina Sweat, Memphis Fire Chief



Gina Sweat began her career as a firefighter with the Memphis Fire Department on May 26, 1992. After rising through the ranks of the department, she was appointed by Mayor Jim Strickland in 2014 as the Fire Chief for the Memphis Fire Department.

She earned a Bachelor's of Business Administration in Marketing from Freed-Hardeman in 1988 where she played collegiate basketball. After joining the Department, she continued her education by obtaining a Bachelor's of Professional Studies in Fire Administration in 2000 and a Master's of Professional Studies in Strategic Leadership in 2013, both from the University of Memphis.

Chief Sweat has focused on many health and safety issues including purchasing SCBA with built-in thermal imaging cameras, on-duty health physicals, multiple carcinogen reduction initiatives, therapy dog program, and an online therapy program. The Memphis Fire Department became the lead agency for COVID-19 vaccinations in Shelby County in 2021 facilitating the delivery of over 1M doses. Chief Sweat contributes these successes and more to the dedicated members of the department who make a difference in the City of Memphis every day.

November 9, 2022 Honoring our Veterans



This past week East Memphis Rotary honored veterans who served to protect our country during times of war; namely, WWII, Korea and Vietnam. We were honored to have veteran members and guests, representing every branch of service to briefly tell us about the places and

Our program speaker was Diane Hight, founder of Forever Young, an organization dedicated to the Honor, Healing, and Hope for veterans. Forever Young has provided many trips to Washington, D.C., Pearl Harbor and numerous European countries, which has proven time and again to be healing for those making the trip.

Forever Young is funded by donations that go directly to grant wishes and services to veterans. It has become a full-time job with no pay for Diane and her family. Her pay is the satisfaction of being able to return veterans to the places where they once fought. Since its beginning in 2006, Forever Young has honored thousands of veterans.
