November 2, 2022 Ted Townsend Greater Memphis Chamber of Commerce



A native Memphian with the blue suede shoes to prove it, Ted Townsend leads regional business recruitment efforts as the chief economic development officer of the Greater Memphis Chamber. Since joining the Chamber in 2020, Townsend has led the Memphis region to numerous economic development wins representing billions of dollars in investment and thousands of new jobs for the region. Among those wins

is the largest single investment in Tennessee history: Ford and SK Innovation's commitment in 2021 to building a \$5.6 billion electric vehicle and battery manufacturing campus known as Blue Oval City near Memphis that will directly employ nearly 6,000 people. At the same time, he has championed a data-driven approach to position the region to capitalize on these wins for future growth.

In his first year at the Chamber, Townsend also served as chief economic development officer for the University of Memphis as part of a partnership to promote the growth of the region. During his tenure at the UofM, Townsend led efforts to secure \$45.9 million for projects, including significant public investments from the state and local governments.

Ted was the co-founder and Chief Operating Officer of Memphis-based arGentis Pharmaceuticals Inc., a privately-held biopharmaceutical company involved in the licensing, development and commercialization of therapies for auto-immune and ophthalmic diseases. Under Ted's leadership, the company raised \$2 million in capital from angel and institutional investors, obtained Orphan Drug Designation in the U.S. and EU, and built an international patent portfolio.

A graduate of the University of Memphis, Townsend has a degree in organizational leadership. He is also a graduate of Leadership Tennessee and the Leadership Memphis Executive Program. He presently serves as the President of the Economic Club of Memphis and numerous other business and civic organizations. He's also public policy advisor to Seeding Success and is the past chairman of the board for Life Science Tennessee
